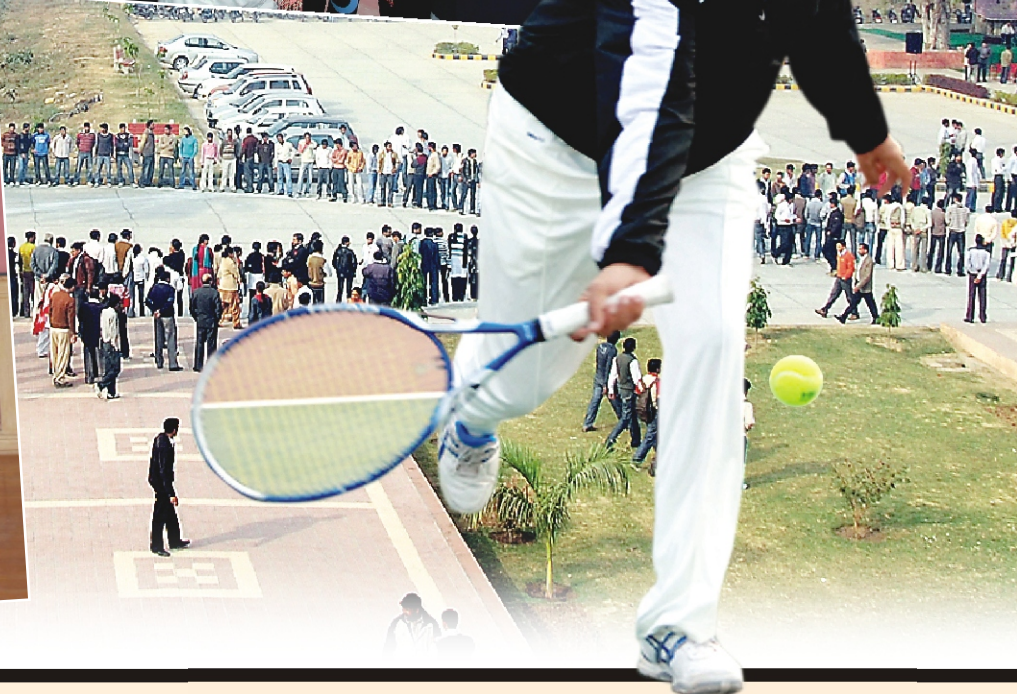

Panjab University clinches both Tennis Championships



To promote sports activities and to give a new look to the University with sports excellency, the Directorate of Sports organized two National Tennis Championships in the very beginning of the year 2010. More than 36 universities took part in these events which were held on university tennis court that has acclaimed an international standard.

Panjab University, Chandigarh bagged the overall championship trophies in both All India Inter Zonal Inter University Tennis Championship and North Zone Inter University Tennis Championship. The latter championship was organized on January 9-14, 2010 while All India Inter Zonal Inter University Championship was held on 22-27th

January in which Panjab University upheld the its first position by defeating University of Delhi, New Delhi by 3-1, whereas the 2nd runner up trophy was clinched by Pune University, Pune. Championship trophies were given by the Haryana Chief Minister Sh. Bhupinder Singh Hooda at its valedictory, and he also announced a grant of Rs. 10 lakh for the development of sports facilities in the University.

Speaking on the occasion Chief Minister Sh. Bhupinder Singh Hooda said sports and games are integral part of human life and it is important for the development of human resources. Participation in sports activities is an effective way of channelising the energy of youth for productive and meaningful purposes. The Council has also sanctioned Development Grant of Rs.15 Lakh to the university for the financial year 2009-10 for the development of Course Materials and Quality Assurance Measures, Student Support Services, Staff Training and Development of National Technology Support System (Application of Information & Communication Technology,

Downlinking and Computerization), Library & Research and Development facilities.

State level exhibition on World Aids Day organises

A state level exhibition was organized by National Service Scheme and Centre for Behavioral Research & Intervention on World AIDS Day on December 1, 2009. The programme was sponsored by Haryana AIDS Control Society. The basic objective of the exhibition was to make people aware about the vulnerable beliefs and behaviors towards HIV infection, and how to modify such cognitions and behaviors individually, at family level, school level and societal level.

A 'Red Ribbon Chain' made by the students and officials of the university and State level poster competition for HIV/AIDS awareness was the prominent features of the day. 450 competitive posters exhibited the theme "Youth Voice on HIV/AIDS free India" were displayed by the participants. A cash prize of Rs.1500, 1000 and 500 was given to the first, second and third position holders. goal is to make it a newspaper by the people and for the people.

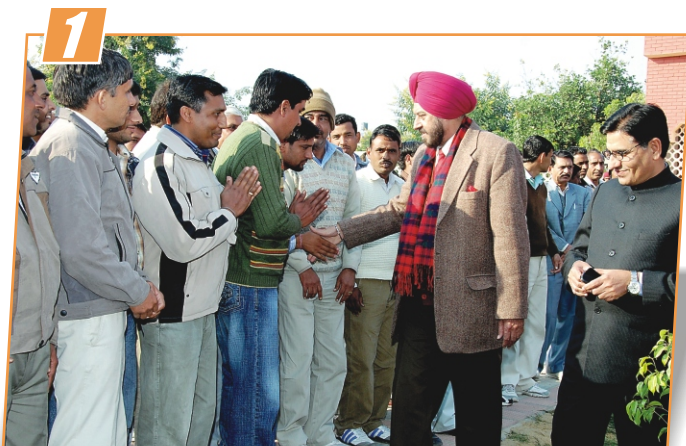

Guru Jambheshwar Ji Maharaj's 29 Commandments

Source of Peace & Inspiration

Launched the eco-religious revolution known as Bishnoism at Samrathal Dhora on eighth day of black fortnight of the month of Kartika (Indian Lunar Calendar) in 1485 A.D. Jambho ji, was born in a remote village Pipasar in 1451 A.D. He was the only child of his parents i.e. Father, Lohat ji Panwar and Mother, Hansa Devi. For first 7 years, Jambho ji was a silent, introvert child. He also spent a lot of time (27 years) as a cowboy like Lord Krishna (Incidentally both had an identical Birth day i.e. Janmashtami!)

At a age of 34, Jambho ji founded Bishnoi religion. His teachings were in poetic form, known as Shabadwani. Although, he preached for next 51 years, travelling across the country, only 120 Shabads i.e. verses of Shabadwani, are available at present. Even these 120 shabads are a source of great wisdom and are sufficient for an individual to understand and follow his path.

Bishnoism, as mention earlier revolves around 29 commandments. Out of these 29 commandments, 8 prescribe to preserve bio diversity and encourage good animal husbandry. 7 Commandments provide directions for healthy social behaviour. 10 commandments are directed towards personal hygiene and maintaining basic good health. Rest 4 commandments provide guidelines for worshipping God daily.

In a nutshell, Jambho ji was a great visionary, who had forseen the consequences of man's actions destroying nature for economic development. He saw the need for environmental protection and weaved his principals into religious commandments so that people can internalise those principals easily.

Commandments :-

1. Tees Din Sutak (To observe segregation of the mother and newborn for 30 days after delivery)
2. Panch Rituvanti Nyaro (To keep woman away from all activities for 5 days during her menstrual periods)
3. Sero Karo Snan (To take early morning bath daily)
4. Sheel, Santosh evam Shudhi rakhana (To maintain both external and internal cleanliness and remaining content)
5. Teen kal ki Naman (To meditate thrice a day i.e. morning, afternoon and evening)
6. Sandhya samay Hari Gun Gana (To sing the Lord's glory and reciting His virtues every evening)
7. Prathkal Havan Karana (To offer daily oblation to the holy fire with a heart filled with feelings of welfare, love and devotion)
8. Pani chhan kar evam Vani shudh bolain (Use filtered water and your speech)
9. Indhan been kar evam dudh Chhan kar (use carefully cleaned fuel/ firewood & milk)
10. Kshma va sahan sheelta rakhen (To be forgiving in nature)
11. Daya Namr bhava se rahna (To be compassionate)
12. Chori nahi karni (Not to steal)
13. Ninda Nahin karni (Not to revile/ condemn someone)
14. Jhoot varjiyo (Not to tell lies)
15. Vad na karno koi (Not to indulge in opprobrium)
16. Amavasya ko vrat rakhno (To observe fast and meditate on no-moon night (and the same day i.e. Amavasya)
17. Bhajan Vishnu batayo joi (To recite the holy name of Lord Vishnu)
18. Jiv daya palni (To be compassionate towards all living beings)
19. Roonkh leelo Nahi Ghavey (Not to fell green trees)
20. Ajar jare jivat mare vas vaikuntha hi pave (To kill the non-perishables!.)
21. Apne hath se raso pakana (To partake food cooked by self/ other religious person or one who is pure by heart and work)
22. Amar rakhave that (To provide a common shelter (Thhat) for goat/sheep to avoid them being slaughtered in abattoirs)
23. Bail badhiya na karave (Not to have bull's castrated)
24. Amal ka sevan nahi karna (Not to partake of opium)
25. Tamakhu ka sevan nahi karna (Not to use tobacco and its products)
26. Bhang ka sevan nahi karna (Not to partake of cannabis)
27. Madyapan ka sevan nahi karna (Not to drink liquor)
28. Mansh nahi khana (Not to eat meat or non-vegetarian dishes)
29. Niley rang ke vastra dharan nahi karna (Not to use blue coloured clothes)
